Heat Pump Installer

The role of a Heat Pump Installer is to oversee the system installation and commissioning of heat pump systems. They undertake the installation, servicing, repair, and maintenance in accordance with up-to-date manufacturer guidelines, assessing and diagnosing faults.

Heat Pump Installers also highlight and manage risks, ensuring risk assessment and safety plans are in place and will troubleshoot when appropriate. They will liaise closely with and support Coordinators, customer service teams, sales teams and Project Managers and provide a professional customer service.

Smart Home Technician

Installing devices in homes to allow people to monitor how much energy they are using.



Countryside Ranger

Protecting wildlife and helping to conserve green spaces and natural habitats.



Environmental Practitioner

Providing employers with a high level of professional environmental advice and expertise.



Ecologist

Studying the relationship between living things and their environment.



Forest Operative

Managing trees, plants and the environment in forests and woodland.



Metal Recycling Operative

Identifying different metals, sorting and separating them into grades.

Ways parents / carers can support with Career Education

Parents and carers play a vital role in helping children prepare for their future career. There are not many young people that have decided which career path they would like to pursue at an early age. Young people will need help to learn about the world of work, the variety of careers available and the wide range of training and education options. There are several ways you can support your child at home by:

- ◆ Have open conversations about interests, strengths and passions and help them explore how these may connect to potential careers
- ◆ Encourage them to research different industries, attend career fairs and seek advice from professionals in areas they are curious about
- ◆ Take them to open events held by local colleges and training providers so that they can learn more about post 16 options available to them.
- ◆ Talk to them about their strengths and what they are good at
- ◆ Help them create a personal email account, this will be needed for college and apprenticeship applications
- ◆ Identify opportunities for volunteering and work experience. These will add valuable insights into different fields and will help develop key transferrable skills

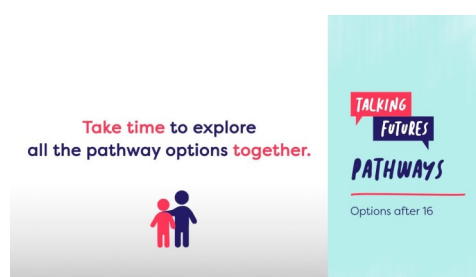
