A Warm Welcome



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Remembrance Day/Children In Need



East Riding 0-19 (25) ISPHN Service



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Prison Me No Way

Prison Me No Way provides real life learning experiences for children and young people, they help to reduce risky behaviour and prevent them becoming involved in crime. They guide and build confidence for students with the knowledge to take control, make positive choices and avoid becoming involved in crime, stay safe and realise their full potential.

The students had got to listen, watch and ask questions, Manni told his story and all the students sat silently listening to his incredible life story and were grateful how he has managed to turn his life around. Many of our students had some great questions to ask. Taff was the prison officer who brought Manni, and he spoke of the law surrounding crime and the path of going to prison. Taff also gave an insight into life inside the prison and how you eat, sleep and spend your time. The students got to look around the mobile prison cell and understand the realisation of living in a confined room with no privacy. We are grateful to Taff and Manni for sharing their stories with us.
