An Exhibition by Hull's Maritime Creatives



Our Year 7's enjoyed participating in 'Run With It'. The students visited the stadium cells this morning where they had the opportunity to ask some fantastic questions about match days!










Student Shout Outs

A Message from the Attendance Manager

EVERY SCHOOL DAY MATTERS

PENALTY NOTICE FINES FOR SCHOOL ATTENDANCE ARE CHANGING

With the introduction of the new National Framework for Penalty Notices, the following changes will come into effect for Penalty Notice Fines issued after the 19 August 2024.

Penalty Notices are issued to change behaviour and reduce the number of school days lost during term time for the purpose of a holiday. The pathway below outlines the decision-making process regarding the action that will be taken when a penalty notice referral is received from your child's school. However, please be aware that action will be considered on a case-by-case basis and may not follow this path.

PER PARENT PER CHILD

Penalty Notice Fines are issued on a per parent per child basis. For example, a fine for a parent with three children will result in receiving three invoices to the value of £160 each.

FIRST OFFENCE

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance the amount will be £160 per parent per child paid within 28 days.

Reduced to £80 per parent per child if paid within 21 days.

MOMENTS MATTER, ATTENDANCE COUNTS.

FIVE CONSECUTIVE DAYS OF TERM TIME LEAVE

Penalty Notice Fines will be issued for term time leave of five or more consecutive days.

Inset training days are school days and can be included in the five or more consecutive days where there was intent to be

10 SESSIONS OF UNAUTHORISED ABSENCE IN A 10 WEEK PERIOD

Penalty Notice Fines will be considered when there have been 10 sessions of unauthorised absence in a 10 week period.

SECOND OFFENCE (WITHIN THREE YEARS)

The second time a Penalty Notice is issued for term time leave or irregular attendance, the amount will be £160 per parent per child within 28 days.

THIRD OFFENCE AND ANY FURTHER OFFENCES (WITHIN THREE YEARS)

The third time an offence is committed for term time leave or irregular attendance, a Penalty Notice will not be issued and the case with be presented straight to the Magistrates' Court.

Magistrates' fines can be up to £2,500 per parent per child. Cases found guilty in Magistrates' Court can show on the parent's future DBS certificate due to the 'failure to sofeguard a child's education'.

[1] Parent: In this Act, unless the context atherwise requires, "parent", in relation to a child or young person, includes any person - who is not a parent of his but who has parental responsibility for him, or (B) who has care of him. Education Act. 1996, section 576

This half term at The Hub we celebrated World Mental Health day and raised money for YoungMinds Mental health charity. To do this staff and students were encouraged to dress in Yellow to send the message that young peoples mental health matters and to raise awareness! We raised a total of £42.50.

In addition to this-our designated MIND support worker is also providing weekly 11 emotional wellbeing support to 6 of our students at our Anlaby site. We have supported 35 students with their emotional wellbeing this half term in the form of 1:1 planned sessions. This is over both our Welton and Anlaby sites.

This equates to 168 hours of 1-1 emotional wellbeing sessions delivered this half term.

Miss Rainforth at our Welton site has also delivered 42 group sessions to support emotional wellbeing this half term.
