#### Ordering of coronavirus (COVID-19) rapid lateral flow home test kits

You can order kits to test your household, childcare bubble or support bubble if at least one member:

- is a school, nursery or college pupil
- works in a school, nursery or college (this includes temporary workers or volunteers)
  You can only use this service if:
- you're 18 or older
- you live in England
- you do not have coronavirus symptoms
- vou have not been told to self-isolate
- you or someone in your household, childcare or support bubble attends a primary school, a nursery, a secondary school, a sixth form, a college, or works at one

The course is free, takes up to three hours to complete (the learner can complete at their own pace) and no previous qualifications are required.




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#### **FSM During Easter**
