In Creative Art and Design our Young Maritime Creatives have started work on the South Blockhouse project.

In textiles we had textiles artist Philippa Naylor visit and work with students, starting work on creating a large scale textiles piece inspired by the architect plans of the South Blockhouse and the Yorkshire Rose. In Art, students have been creating initial designs based on the architect plans incorporating medieval style patterns. In 3D design students have created clay buildings inspired by medieval building design. Next Term students will be developing their work towards a large scale mural and in food technology creating a medieval style banquet.










We would like to thank all the external agencies and our fabulous staff for their support and commitment. The students engaged well, were very respectful and asked some fantastic questions.














#### We're using Arbor's free Parent Portal and Parent App






#### We've chosen Arbor to help us manage our school.

Arbor is a simple, smart and cloud-based MIS (Management Information System), which helps us work faster, smarter and more collaboratively as a school. The Parent App and Parent Portal mean we can keep you informed about your child's life at school in a much more accessible way. Log into Arbor to see and update your child's information, get live updates and make payments or bookings on the go!

The Parent Portal works on Google Chrome (computer or laptop) and you can download the Parent App from the App Store or Google Play Store on your phone (Android 5.0; iOS 10.0 and upwards).

#### How to get started

- 1. Wait for your welcome email from us telling you Arbor is ready you won't be able to log in before
- 2. Click the link in your welcome email to set up your password
- 3. Go to the App or Google Play Store on your phone and search 'Arbor'
- 4. Click 'Install' on Android or 'Get' on iPhone then open the App
- 5. Enter your email, select the school, then enter your password
- 6. Accept the Terms & Conditions and enter your child's birthday



#### Need help using Arbor?

Contact the school office if you have questions about Arbor, the App or Parent Portal. Tell us the type and model of your phone, e.g. an iPhone SE, and include screenshots or screen recordings.

To safeguard student data in line with General Data Protection Regulations (GDPR), Arbor only works directly with schools.

#### Some tips to try:

- Ensure your username is the email address you use for Arbor.
   Ask us to check the email address linked to your account.
- 2. Reset your password from the login page, or ask us to do this.
- If the login email was sent to you more than 96 hours ago, the password link will have expired. Ask us to send it again.
- Ask the school office to check that your email address has not been used twice - e.g. on another guardian or child's profile.
- 5. Enter the birthday of one of your children to log in.
- Only relatives who are **Primary Guardians** of a child can access the Arbor App. Ask us to check you can access Arbor.



#### A Message from the Attendance Manager

Attendance Incentives for Students:

- Students who attend a full week of school will receive a reward at the end of each week.
- At the end of each term, £5 vouchers will be given to every student with over 95% attendance and £10 vouchers for every student with 100% attendance.
- Each term, the Attendance Raffle will be drawn with the winner receiving a prize worth £20 (each week of full attendance gives you one ticket in the draw).
- The Attendance League runs every term, with the best attending form winning a trophy for the form and a meal from McDonalds.
