


The end of the school year has not been like a normal one for students or our staff! It is vital that we support our students with this unusual transition phase.

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A Message from our Attendance Manager

A reminder that the following incentives are in place for the next academic year:

- ⇒ Daily points count towards “Award Fridays” - Students are only able to get these points if they attend or have a valid reason for their absence.
- ⇒ £5 voucher and certificate for those with over 95% attendance each term / £10 voucher for those with 100% attendance.
- ⇒ £10 voucher and certificate for the student with the most improved attendance each term.

Sports Day


The Hub School held an extra curriculum Sports Day, where the competitive sides of both students and staff came out. Students showcased their sporting talents in the sunshine.

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Covid Local Support Grant—Free School Meal Support

The Government has announced an extension to the Covid Local Support Grant, until 30th September 2021. This means that all students who are **eligible for Free School Meals who also have an address in the East Riding** are able to access Free School Meal vouchers to cover the 6 week Summer Holidays.

On behalf of the East Riding Council, The Hub School will provide eligible students with vouchers, totalling £90. This equates to £15 per week.

Year 11 students who have now left The Hub School, as they have ceased to be of compulsory school age, will be included and receive Free School Meal vouchers, if they are eligible to do so.

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East Riding Holiday Activities and Food Programme

Following the success of the Easter Holiday Activity Programme, The East Riding of Yorkshire Council will be providing a summer and Christmas Holiday Programme, as part of the national Holiday Activities and Food Programme (HAF) for children and young people who are eligible for Free School Meals.

The HAF Programme provides opportunities for children to participate in engaging activities in a safe environment which supports the development of resilience, character and well-being, along with their wider educational attainment.

The food component of the scheme is designed to tackle the issue of holiday hunger, by providing quality nutritious food and knowledge of health nutrition.

A wide range of activities have been planned for the East Riding, including sports and outdoor play clubs, artist activities in partnership with local heritage sites, theatres and music workshops and Lego 'STEAM' sessions in East Riding Libraries.

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
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COVID-19 Track and Trace
