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COVID-19 Information

Guidelines are ever changing, however current rules state it is not recommended that children and young people are tested for COVID-19 unless directed to by a health professional.



Individuals with mild symptoms such as a runny nose, sore throat, or slight cough, who are otherwise well, can continue to attend their education setting.

If a child or young person has a positive COVID-19 test result or displays symptoms including high temperature, fever or chills, they should stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days after the day they took the test.

At the end of this period, if the individual has a high temperature or feels unwell, they should continue to stay at home and avoid contact with other people until 24 hours after they no longer have a high temperature and they feel well enough to resume normal activities.

After 3 days, if they feel well and do not have a high temperature, the risk of passing the infection on to others is much lower. This is because children and young people tend to be infectious to other people for less time than adults.

Children and young people who usually go to school, college or childcare and who live with someone who has a positive COVID-19 test result should continue to attend as normal.

The most common symptoms of COVID-19:

- ⇒ A high temperature
- ⇒ A new, continuous cough
- ⇒ A loss or change to your sense of smell or taste

Free School Meals—Summer

We will once again be supporting families who are eligible for free school meals with the voucher scheme. Therefore Parents/Carers of students who are <u>eligible for free school meals</u>, **and** who <u>live in the East Riding</u> will receive a **£65 voucher** to cover the summer holiday.

If you live elsewhere you'll need to contact your own local authority.

These vouchers will be sent in the usual way, either by email and/or mobile phone.

Your child might be eligible for FSM if you access:

- ⇒ Income Support
- ⇒ Income-based Jobseeker's Allowance or Employment and Support Allowance
- ⇒ Support under part VI of the Immigration and Asylum Act 1999
- ⇒ The guaranteed element of Pension Credit
- ⇒ Child Tax Credit (provided you're not also entitled to Working Tax Credit and have an annual gross income of no more than £16,190)
- ⇒ Working Tax Credit run-on
- ⇒ Universal Credit, provided you have an annual net earned income not exceeding £7,400 (£616.67 per month)

Well done to 7B for being the best attending form this term making them the winners of the Attendance League, they really enjoyed their McDonalds lunch!

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


Students of the Year
