






### Outreach




### **Young Maritime Creatives**

Thank you to our staff and students for making poppies for our display. A special thanks to Miss Sykes for putting together this fantastic tribute for Remembrance Day.






### The Ace House








### Donations

Well done to 11B for being the best attending form this term making them the winners of the Attendance League, they really enjoyed their McDonalds lunch!






### **Students of the Term**
