The continued success of our Outreach support across the Trust is thanks to the dedication and expertise of our staff team. It's heartening to see our relational routines positively impacting relationships and culture throughout the school.

Perhaps most notably, we've seen a significant improvement in attendance this academic year. Compared to the same period last year, we've achieved a 5% increase in attendance. This is a fantastic achievement, and we're determined to build on this success throughout the Spring and Summer terms.

As we move forward, we remain committed to providing the best possible support and education for all our pupils. The progress we've made is encouraging, but we know there's always more to be done. I'm incredibly proud of our school community and excited about what we can achieve together in the coming months.






Careers
